This is difficult to capture as they have the Acute Inpatient Rehab Program, an Inpatient Medical Service for kids who aren't appropriate for 3 hours, a Consultative service where they consult on patients throughout our 289 bed hospital, and an outpatient clinic. While our actual acute inpatient rehab program is fairly small, the consultative service can keep them extremely busy./ Also, ratios specific to rehab patients, not acute care where ratios are higher

Nursing 10 hours per pt day; staff rations based on productivity per hour

All of our therapists and nurses see a mix of rehab and acute post op. Our therapists additionally see an outpatient mix during the day. Our full time therapists each get 2 rehab patients on their caseload (kids are typically seen twice a day) and then we fill in the rest of the day with acute post ops and outpatients. I don't know if our information is useful to you since we don't have therapists dedicated to just inpatient rehab
