We have 1 PhD level SLP who works at the local University, but also maintains her affiliation with our hospital. We have an open position for an additional SLP researcher, and the goal would be for 50% clinical, 50% research.</p>	<p>Along with working on their own specific area of expertise, our SLP Researchers are expected to help guide research within our Division. This means they help other clinicians develop appropriate proposals for small scale projects that could be shared at local or national conferences -- and when appropriate, submit to peer-reviewed journals. We track the number of publications, presentations, and grant submissions each year - and our goal is that these numbers rise each year</p>	<p>We have expectations of submitting for grant funding, but at this time, the positions do not require grant funding. All involved persons are aware that this could change depending on budgetary concerns and/or leadership changes within the Division</p>
