

ORG	Do PT and OT see all the Spina Bifida patients that come to clinic? If not, which patients do they see?	Do patients seen in clinic receive PT and OT at each clinic visit?	What is the frequency of your clinic?	What assessments are used in clinics by each discipline?
ORG A	We see almost all of the patients that come. If a patient is established with OT or PT in the Methodist Le Bonheur system, we don't always see them.	No, we tend to see patients annually. We do see the babies under a year 1-2 times a year	We have pre-clinic visits that pts come to for testing, but our multidisciplinary clinic is 1 x a month, January to November (we don't have clinic in December)	We don't do formal testing in clinic, but do MMT for older patients, functional strength, functional mobility, and clinical observation (fine motor skills, VMI, hand writing assessment, gait, balance, etc)
ORG B	We see all CCS connected patients. Will sometimes see HMO/PPO if family gives permission for billable.	Not at each clinic visit. We see them at minimum 1x/year, other disciplines may see them more depending on the child's medical needs. When they are under 1 year old, we may follow them more regularly to check in regarding feeding/developmental needs and make sure they have been connected to services. We are allowed to see patients up to 4x/year.	1x/week from 8am-12pm	OT: MMT, dynamometer/pinch and grip strength, ROM, DAYC-2 Fine Motor Subdomain, Informal interview re: ADLs including self-cath, bathing, bathing equipment, driving screener PT: AIMS, MMT, SOSBMR-YA
ORG C	PT sees all patients. OT is not involved in clinic.	PT sees all patients	1x/week, ½ day clinic that schedules 8 patients each clinic visit	PT uses ROM, MMT, Functional Mobility Scale, gait and postural observation
ORG D	Only OT staffs our actual spina bifida clinic for Adaptive Equipment needs. Direct referrals are made for OT and/or PT ongoing therapy needs and we would evaluate at a separate visit and then initiate therapy as appropriate
